

## AP Human Geography Summer work for 2019-20

1. The starting point for this class is geography literacy. The goal for the summer work is to have the student be familiar with major geographic areas so that they can interact with the material during the school year. This summer work will be a great step to building knowledge of place names and locations. (As well as a strong foundation for their grade.) I strongly encourage each student to get a head start on the class so they will not fall behind at the beginning of the school year.
2. Each student needs to complete a map of the United States and a World map. This assignment is due the first day of school. Students are expected to label each point on the list that has been provided for you. Be careful to remember when a continent is listed and it says countries, please label all countries. You may create a key, legend, or number the labeling etc. Europe is a small continent you may add an additional Europe map if you desire. Abbreviations for direction portions of countries and states are ok. (north or south) Please write the rest out. All maps will need to be colored as well. You may have artistic license when coloring, though it needs be colored. (some find it helpful to laminate, though not required) A map not fully colored(land masses) will receive point deductions.
3. Each student will be provided a 2x3ft poster to label the world map and a separate map for the USA. The world map will carry a 100 point minor assignment. The USA map is a 50 point minor assignment. (Most of the homework assignments are 20 point assignments.) There is only one world map per student so please be careful not to make a grievous error when completing the map. A replacement poster may be difficult to get but we can work out a solution if necessary.
4. During the first week of school there will be 2 tests. Probably the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> class period. One on the United States and one on the world. There are 100 points on each map to label. These will be major grades. Students that do not complete the maps during summer will still be required to do the maps at the beginning of school and still be responsible for the tests at the beginning of the school year.
5. There is a free geography program that can be downloaded called Seterra. Many students use this to practice and quiz themselves. Human geography is taught as a topical study instead of regional. Knowing physical locations helps students apply the information they will be learning about human locations and activities around the world.
6. For those who are wondering about the nature of geography. I would recommend a supplemental book called Why Geography Matters by Harm de Blij. This is not required but gives a good understanding.
7. Finally, my geography classes engage in a fun, friendly, competition called The Blue Ribbon award. Top maps are nominated, voted on, and a winner declared. Candy and bragging rights follow.

Tiny Islands in the middle of the Ocean that are not significant do not need to be labeled.
